Constitution

Ruthrieson Community Centre Association is a Scottish charity. It is governed by a constitution approved by the trustees and registered with OSCR on 24 May 2013.

Trustees

The trustees are responsble for the management of the centre.

The trustees, who are all members themselves, are appointed by the members.

Objectives and Activities

The Association's purpose is to promote the well being of the inhabitants of the Ruthrieston and Holburn neighbourhood of Aberdeen City by advancing education and providing or assisting in providing for learning opportunities or other social and leisure time activities. The Association co-operates with Aberdeen City Council in achieving these objectives and in particular leases Ruthrieston Community Centre from the Council.

The Association receives a grant from the Council to be used towards the maintenance and management of the Centre but the main source of income is receipts from room hire. The Community Centre's facilities principally comprise a main hall with associated kitchen, an all purpose room and a meeting room all located in the main building. In addition there is a stand-alone building known as the Playshed located in the car park. There is a disabled access and toilet located in the main building. The facilities are used by all ages, cater for all sectors of the local and wider community and are in frequent use. Activities include Arts and Crafts, fitness and exercise classes, as well as social and community use e.g. Gamblers Anonymous and local residents' association meetings.

Achievements and Performance

Our small community centre continues to be a lively place of activity. Arts and language learning are a big part of our programme during the day with many retired people enjoying the benefits and challenges that learning new skills brings. Many centre users also enjoy the health benefits of regular Pilates and Yoga classes.

We continue to be a focus for religious and social activities among the city's large Nigerian population. In addition we provide space for a number of local and national charities to deliver their services locally.

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

Ruthrieston Community Centre is a 19th century building which requires continuous maintenance with major repairs and upgrades necessary from time to time and it is the Association's policy to maintain sufficient reserves to cover both planned and unforeseen major expenditure on such works.

Receipts amounted to £41,120 (2023 £34,270) and payments totalled £25,663 (2023 £27,594).

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Ruthrieston Community Centre Association

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 January 2024, which are set out on pages 4 to 6.
