The organisation is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation - No SC018381.

The constituted organisation is administered by elected office bearers and representatives of the users of the services provided. Membership of the board of trustees is determined as set out in the written constitution of Toryglen Community Hall.

Activities and Performance 2023/24

The hall celebrates its 35th anniversary in 2024 and continues to offer a variety of activities for all ages. Again, this year has been very busy, and we are fully booked each weekend for private functions until the end of 2024. We continue to receive enquiries for more groups, activities and private functions than we can accommodate.

Grants from Glasgow Communities Fund, Bank of Scotland, GCVS and Langside Area Partnership contributed to our core costs, and provided: after school activities, delivered by the Jeely Piece Club; health and well-being activities and groups for local people; drama workshops for young people, delivered by Halo Arts; equipment for our new youth club.

Grants received from Sanctuary Housing and The Robertson Trust will enable us to employ youth workers

Our Community Development Worker continued to support groups activities in the hall and developed new partnerships with local schools. We always welcome suggestions for future activities/events.

We would like to thank all our funders – their support enables us to provide a wide range of services for local people. We would also like to thank our partners, the local community, and all our service users. Thanks also to our dedicated staff, without whom we couldn't operate.

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

Future plans /Sustainability

After 5 years, we have reached the final stage of the asset transfer process and expect the acquisition of the building to be completed in April or May. Next stage will be to look at the feasibility of extending the building to give us additional space for new groups, activities and private hires.

for her determination and commitment to achieving this.

The Trustees intend to build our reserves to cover six months' running costs. However, in common with most organisations, being reliant on some grant income can sometime make it difficult to maintain reserve levels. The Reserves Policy is in place to facilitate any expenses under our legal responsibility and for the upkeep of the hall.

Unrestricted reserves at 31st March 2024 were £135,289 (2023 - £83,037) and are deemed appropriate by the trustees for the charitable purposes of the SCIO.
