

# Charity Reorganisation – Summary of Application

## Type of Scheme

Lethem Park Trustees (SC003557) has applied to the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) for approval of a reorganisation scheme for a variation of the constitution of the charity (whether or not in relation to its purposes) under section 42(3)(a) of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 (the 2005 Act).

The charity was established on 20 August 1937 by a Deed of Trust.

The charity is established for the purpose of providing facilities for recreation, sports, games and athletics for the Leith Battalion of the Boys' Brigade and for the purpose of providing the facilities for the Ex-Members of the 1st Leith Company of the Boys' Brigade.

## Reasons for reorganisation

The trustees wish to vary the constitution to include:

- (a) a power to amend the Trust Deed; and
- (b) a power to wind up.

## Reorganisation conditions

The trustees suggest that the following reorganisation condition is:

42(2)(d) that it is desirable to introduce a provision (other than a provision setting out a new purpose) to a charity's constitution

The trustees suggest the condition is met because:

They are considering future options. The Trust Deed does not contain a power to amend the Trust Deed or a power to wind up as modern constitutions would. Adding these powers would accommodate the trustees' plans to wind up if they decide to do so.

## Reorganisation outcomes

The trustees suggest that the following reorganisation outcome is met:

39(1)(ii) – that the reorganisation scheme will enable the charity to be administered more effectively.

The trustees suggest the outcome is met because the charity was established in 1945 with specific objects related to football both within the Boys' Brigade and in the community in which it is located. The charity has seen reduced demand for its services and the objects for which it was formed are not all any longer relevant. The trustees are considering the charity's future and one of the options under consideration is the winding up of the charity and the transfer of its assets to a charity which may be able to make better use of the assets for a purpose aligned to its existing purpose.

The reorganisation would broaden the options available to the charity by allowing them to implement a winding up and/or amendment to its constitution and give them a clear provisions for doing so.

## How to make a representation in relation to the proposed reorganisation scheme

Any person may make a representation to OSCR either supporting or opposing this proposed reorganisation scheme. Should you wish to make a representation, you may do so by writing to OSCR providing the following information:

- Your name and address
- The name of the charity concerned
- The nature of the representation and reasons for it

These are the terms of Regulation 5 of the Charities Reorganisation (Scotland) Regulations 2007).
