

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

To actively engage and support young people in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society. Young people work in partnership with adults; work together based on the values of Scouting (Integrity; Respect; Care; Belief; and Cooperation); enjoy what they are doing and have fun; participate in indoor and outdoor activities; learn by doing; share in spiritual reflection; take responsibility and make choices; undertake new and challenging activities; and make and live by their promise.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The main activities of the Scout Group were providing fun, challenge and adventure to young people through a balanced programme of activities, events and experiences based around subject areas we call Programme Zones, starting in the Beaver Scout Section and continuing to the Scout Section by way of indoor and outdoor activities, weekly meetings and adventurous activities including camps in Scotland and abroad, allowing young people to progress through the Programme Zones and record their achievements.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Continued improvement and upgrading the Scout Centre. Essential maintenance has continued throughout the year.

Young people gaining Chief Scout's Awards and Duke of Edinburgh Awards. Meetings continued remotely and virtually for part of the year due to the COVID 19 pandemic. The return to face-to-face meetings was well received by all packs with group activities returning and also planning for summer camps returning.

Unfortunately, no fund-raising events were held during the year because of COVID 19 pandemic. which impacted income generated compared to the prior year.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The funds represent income earned but not yet utilised in supporting charitable activities. At 31 March 2023, the charity held £52,113 at the bank including £3,375 held by the Beaver Sections; £4,904 held by the Cub Sections; and £3,968 held by the Scout Section.

Ongoing development, maintenance and repairs of the Scout Centre can be significant, and a Reserve Fund has been maintained in this respect of £25,000. Some of these funds were used towards the cost of maintenance and upgrading of the Scout Centre Significant funds will be required for (a) maintenance and repair of part of the roof of the building which is flat, and (b) Electrical Installation and Condition Report (EICR) mandatory testing and inspection of circuit boards, wiring and electrical accessories which must be completed in the latter half of 2024/25. The Trustees have designated a reserve fund of £25,000 (reviewed annually) to meet at least one year's operating costs and the Trustees consider this to be appropriate to respond promptly to any financial demands. The reserves policy maintained is compliant with the guidelines provided in the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The Trustees did not receive any remuneration or expenses from the Charity during the year and are not paid any expenses for attendance at meetings.

The reimbursement of expenses is restricted to receipted expenditure incurred on behalf of the Charity.

Details of any deficit

During the year a deficit has been recorded of £10,934 reflecting the reduced levels of fundraising that was possible due to COVID 19 lockdown restrictions being in force and thus previous cash held by each section including the Group account has been eroded.

The Group continued to ensure maintenance of the Scout hall and other activities were funded in support of the objectives of the Charity.

Other optional information

The Scout Group, established in 1909 and part of Scouts Scotland, is a voluntary uniformed youth organisation. The Group has been twinned with a Norwegian Sea Scout Group, near Stavanger since 1977 and since 2015 has partnership agreements with 3 schools in Gomel, Belarus. Stavanger and Gomel are 2 of Aberdeen's twinned cities.

As at 31 March 2023, the membership of the Group was 190 youth members and 59 adult volunteers, in 2 Beaver Scout Colonies; 3 Cub Scout Packs; and 1 Scout Troop, with a waiting list of about 23 of an age to join Beavers and about 19 of an age to join Cubs.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of 21st Aberdeen (Cults) Scout Group

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2023.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
