TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2024

The trustees are pleased to present their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2024.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the charity's constitution, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019).

Objectives and activities

The charity is a church established for charitable purposes only, and in particular the objectives are:

To advance the Christian religion for public benefit in the United Kingdom and worldwide through:

- · The organisation and provision of Christian worship;
- The provision of such facilities and services as are appropriate for the church, to enable it to fulfil its
 mission to the members of the Church, visitors to the Church, the local community and the wider
 community;
- · The provision of facilities for Christian training and service;
- The support and provision of Christian evangelism and outreach;
- The provision of assistance to the wider Christian church and its ministries.

Achievements and performance

I am delighted to write this report as a reflection of what was an exciting and positive year in the life of Falkirk Vineyard Church. Whilst we were presented with challenges across the year God has been faithful to us. I have captured some of the key highlights below:

- The financial position of FVC was further strengthened by an increase in regular tithing and one-off gifts.
 We also saw incredible financial provision with the creation of a property fund further setting us on the road towards our own permanent Sunday venue.
- 2024 saw FVC take its first long term (5 year) lease on a property (66 union road) creating an exciting
 place for our Love Falkirk food pantry, church office and space for ministry. The renovation process
 started in late 2024 and was fully funded by grant funding and the church property fund.
- As a board we were delighted to create two new staff team roles on 1 year FTC (Worship Pastor & Kids and Family Pastor). As a result, it has been exciting to see the growth and development in both ministries. We were also able to extend our Teaching Pastor and Senior Pastor FTC for a further year.
- We ended the year with a surplus which allowed us to invest in new technology to aid kids sign in and safeguarding as well as a hearing loop system for our Sunday services.
- We have seen growth in Sunday services attendance and a huge jump in the children in FVKids each
 week. Our Children's & Families Pastor has increased the number of rooms we use for Kid's Church
 with further plans for growth.
- Safeguarding was a key focus for the board in 2024 and as a result we appointed both a new Safeguarding Officer and Deputy Safeguarding Officer and also a trustee dedicated to overseeing our safeguarding. The team have spent considerable time testing and strengthening our safeguarding procedures – A massive thanks from me for the time spent by the team.
- We also refreshed all our policies across the year to add further governance and controls to ensure our ongoing security and financial prudence.
- Love Falkirk continued to expand our ministry in Falkirk providing c9000 meals across the year as well
 as providing gifts and Christmas dinner for 80 family's. We are very grateful to our grant funding partners
 who have bought into the vision we have for Falkirk and have supported us financially to help our
 mission to bring families out of poverty.
- Whilst the Love Falkirk team were presented with a challenge when our original location for the pantry
 was closed at short notice, we saw incredible blessing by being able to buy a van to provide a mobile
 pantry.

- Our Mainly Music Ministry each week brings together parents/guardians of around 25 Children in song
 and fun. It has been excellent to see the support that mainly music is to so many families in a supportive
 and loving environment.
- Each year, FVC tithe 15% of our income to other causes this year we were delighted to support Quiet
 waters, Love the one, Go Youth Trust, and Polmont Community Hub over and above our 5% tithe to
 VCUKI.

It has been an exciting year seeing God move across all areas of the church. A massive thanks to the board of Trustees who operate with the integrity and rigour needed to maintain good governance alongside supporting the vision for FVC.

Most of all, the glory belongs to God who has supported and sustained us in 23/24 and I am excited to see how FVC will continue to minister to the people of Falkirk.

Blessing

Financial review

There was a surplus for the year of £83,541 (2023: £22,538).

Risk management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Plans for future periods

As we look forward into the next financial year we continue to build financial resilience with a particulate focus on opportunity to secure a permanent Sunday venue. As a board our focus remains on supporting the vision of Falkirk vineyard church serving the people of Falkirk.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation and is governed by it's constitution.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees, who are also the directors of Falkirk Vineyard Church for the purpose of company law, are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company Law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that year.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the charity and financial information included on the charity's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

The trustees' report was approved by the Board of Trustees.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees, who are also the directors of Falkirk Vineyard Church for the purposes of company law, are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investments (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. 1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Falkirk Vineyard Church is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Company. The registered office is 51 Sunnyside Avenue, Brightons, Falkirk, FK2 0GE.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared on a Reeipts and Payments basis in accordance with the charity's Deed of Constitution, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)". The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

1.2 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives unless the funds have been designated for other purposes. General funds total £78,604 (2023: £53,543) at the year end and designated funds total £589 (2023: £421).

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements. Restricted funds at the year-end amounted to £73,682 (2023: £15,370).

Love Falkirk

Love Falkirk was initially funded by the local authority and has continued to receive funding through generous donations from the community and The National Lottery. It operates a pantry and garden to help support the local community with various events throughout the year.

Eden Ministries

Falkirk Vineyard Church is the UK ambassador for Eden Ministry and promotes the organisation through the sale of the jewellery made by survivors of human trafficking and sexual exploitation in Asia. The proceeds from the sale of the items is all fed back to the organisation to fund programmes in the areas where the jewellery is made.

Compassion Ministry

These funds relate to the previous compassion ministry which has now been extended to the Love Falkirk project. A transfer of the remaining funds took place during the prior year.

Premises Fund

These funds relate to the ongoing refurbishment of the new Union Road premises.
