Charitable purposes	<p>Kenyawi Kids objects are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) The prevention or relief of poverty by promoting self-sustainability in relation to orphan care in Malawi and Kenya.</li> <li>b) The relief of those in need by reason of age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage. Kenyawi Kids work will benefit orphans in Kenya and Malawi through projects involving farming and education.</li> <li>c) The advancement of education through agriculture education and the promotion of self-sustainability through projects that will teach children key life skills.</li> <li>d) The advancement of citizenship or community development. There are a variety of ways in which this can be done, including purchasing farm land for the orphanages and carrying out training programmes within local communities in order to promote a self-sufficient living.</li> </ul>
Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects	<p>Kenyawi Kids fundraises in the UK to support 3 orphan care projects in Malawi: STEKA (Step Kids Awareness), Mayamiko Child Care Centre and Catch the Fish creative arts centre. We support nutrition programmes, education fees and running costs alongside farming projects to increase self-sustainability. There has been a huge demand on our budget this year due to the rising cost of living again in 2025-2026.</p>

## Achievements and performance

### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Kenyawi Kids have supported a student through his first year of a nursing degree at a Malawian university and he is performing well and enjoying his course. We have funded over 150 children with school fees and educational resources for school at STEKA, Mayamiko and Catch the Fish Foundation. This included uniforms and learning materials for nursery, primary, secondary and vocational courses. We funded fertiliser input on the STEKA farm to support maize, bananas and bean production.


