# Public Meeting to Form Raith Rovers Community Foundation

A public meeting was held within Stark's Park, Kirkcaldy on Thursday 12 June 2014 to set up a new charitable organisation that would use the name of Raith Rovers to carry out community development work in and around the Kirkcaldy Area.

#### Constitution

The Raith Rovers Community Foundation (RRCF) is governed by its constitution which was adopted by public meeting on the 12 June 2014. The Raith Rovers Community Foundation (RRCF) was registered as a charity on 10 March 2015 and from this date is constitutionally governed as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO).

#### **Appointment of Trustees**

RRCF is managed by a Committee of Trustees consisting of not less than four and not more than nine eligible members, one of whom must be nominated by the Board of Raith Rovers Football Club. The Committee of Trustees appoint four officers, namely, Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Treasurer and Secretary. All members of at least one years standing are eligible to be nominated for the Committee of Trustees and Trustees who have served on the Committee for at least one year are eligible to be nominated for the post of Chairperson. All trustees are eligible for re-election without bar. The Trustees have a delegated power of co-option and right of appointment of additional Trustees.

#### Membership

Membership is open to those who have an interest in furthering the purposes of RRCF and who are over 16 years of age and one nominated representative from the Board of Raith Rovers Football Club. Employees of RRCF are not eligible for membership.

#### Objectives and Activities

#### Charitable Purposes

The purposes of the Raith Rovers Community Foundation are to advance: -

- the education of children, young people and adults by providing opportunities to engage in the study, practice and teaching of community sports and community learning which develops their spiritual, mental and physical capacities and enable them to improve their conditions of life
- public participation in sport in Kirkcaldy and the surrounding area through the promotion, alone or in conjunction with others, of participation in football and other sporting activities and acting as advisors in relation to the development of football and other sporting activities.
- health in Fife by the promotion, alone or in conjunction with others, of the benefits of physical activity and provision of assistance in relation to sports-related and healthy lifestyle

#### Mission Statement

Using the power of football Raith Rovers Community Foundation will work in partnership with members of and stakeholders in local communities to empower individuals to improve their lives and their environment.

All programmes and initiatives delivered by *Raith Rovers in the Community* will contribute to four key outcomes and areas of focus; raising educational achievement, creating pathways to employment, building healthier lifestyles and bring communities together.

#### Achievements and Performance

In 2023 we delivered 1400 hours worth of participation through our Active Programmes. We provided 1500 meals to socially isolated backgrounds. We have achieved a 90% positive outcome through our employability programmes. We have covered 130 miles worth of conversation across the local Fife Community through our support groups. We have attended 9 Community open days in support of our local partners and demonstrated how we can work together. We have worked with Raith Rovers FC and Rovers Down South to help provide 429 free match tickets for under12's in the 2023/2024 season. We have delivered 288 hours of safe and engaging learning environments for our additional support needs players. We prepared over 50 christmas meals and entertainment as part of our Festive Friends

2024 is set to be another fantastic year for the Foundation as we continue to grow and stabilize our provision in the community as one of the leading organisations in the area.

RRCF Trustees continue to support the work of the Foundation and maintain its governance.

In a wider sense, the work of the Foundation has served to strengthen the view that football as a sport and pastime, when allied to the profile and cachet of the local professional football club, can enhance and improve the quality of life of people who have the greatest need in our communities.

#### Financial Review

Overall, the financial outturn for the year resulted in a deficit £29,295.76.

Total receipts for the period were £338,239.36 whilst payments totalled £367,535.12.

As a consequence, the year end cash and bank balance decreased from £82,868.10 to £55,904.84.

# **Reserves Policy**

The reserves consist entirely of the cash and bank account where funds are retained towards RRCF programme of activities. The reserves policy is to retain a level of unrestricted funding that, at minimum, finances RRCF for a further three months if the grant income is withdrawn.

#### Plans for Future Period

The Committee of Trustees works hard to continue and develop RRCF and meet the demands in the community. Efforts continue to generate income and attract funding from a variety of sources, whilst managing costs, that provides ongoing sustainability of the RRCF.
