A new framework for the provision of IT consumables has recently been awarded and will commence on 1 November 2016. The framework is available to all Charities registered in Scotland.

Updated Trustee Declaration Form for NEW charities

We have recently updated our Charity Trustee Declaration Forms. They must be used when you apply to become a charity.



These forms allow the people in management and control of the charity – the charity trustees – to assure us that they are aware of their responsibilities and are not disqualified. We can then use the information to carry out checks to ensure people are not disqualified from being a trustee. As the new form also collects further email details we can also email the charity trustees details of registration and charity trustee duties should the organisation be granted charitable status. If you are part way through applying to us, and already have trustee declarations signed on the old format, we can accept these up until the end of November.

Charities preparing accrued accounts do so in line with the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), which OSCR and the Charity Commission for England and Wales (CCEW) are jointly responsible for the development and

maintenance of.

We are currently holding a research exercise intended to identify necessary changes for the next Charities SORP and have published an invitation to comment, setting out five areas where views are sought on how the next SORP could be improved.

One of our commitments as a regulator is to work to improve our services, making sure that they are as efficient and effective as possible.



For some time, we have been concerned about one of the processes that charities can use to "incorporate". Here, we are particularly talking about changing from being an unincorporated association to becoming a SCIO or a company.

We have done some work looking at the process and have decided that from early November of this year onwards, we will only offer one option for charities looking to incorporate.
