Charities SORP Committee and Process - governance review



The four charity regulators in the UK and Republic of Ireland have decided to hold a governance review of the constitution and composition of the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) committee and the SORP making process.


The governance review will be undertaken by an Oversight Panel which will be made up of a representative from each of the four charity regulators, alongside an observer from the Financial Reporting Council. The panel will be assisted by the staff of the Charity Commission for England and Wales and OSCR.

The work of the panel will be overseen by Professor Gareth Morgan, an independent Chair retained by the SORP-making body.

The guidance, Fraud: how

to reduce the risks in your charity, highlights some of the risks of fraud to which charities are vulnerable and provides practical advice for trustees on how to tackle it.

It tells trustees:

- what their legal duties are
- how they can reduce the risk of fraud; and
- how OSCR will consider instances of fraud in charities.

In addition to our fraud guidance, we also have a <u>factsheet on</u> <u>cybercrime</u> that gives trustees some top tips on protecting their charity from this threat.
